13 *Misbehaviour* I know of no misbehavior of the ecclesiastical officers; and the officers of my church faithfully perform their respective duties.

5 Chapels There is one parochial chapel and no other church, always belonging to the rector of Upham for the time being (though the parishes are distinct). The said chapel goes by no other name that we can learne but the name of the parish. It is served alwayes by a curate, nominated by the said rector of Upham, and paid by him who has the whole tythes, great and small; the whole fabrick which is repaired as well as the chancel as the body of the chapel by the parishioners.

6 Lecturer There is only a curate, at present myself.

7 Papists There is one family only; a man and his wife and 3 children; the man is only a rackrenter.¹⁰

8 Dissenters There is not one meeting of protestant dissenters, and but one protestant dissenter, who is of the Presbyterian perswasion.

9 Gentry &c. Not one.

10 Schools There are no schools endowed, nor any other but such as a poor woman keeps to teach poore children for a small matter as the parties can agree.

11 Charities The sum of 10s. p.a. only hath been given (with the payment of which an estate called Foxholes in the parish of Bishopstoake is charged) to be paid to the churchwardens on the feast of All Saints yearly in Durley church porch, and by them to be distributed among such of the poore that receive no alms of the parish and are most necessitous and according to their severall necessities, at the discretion of the said churchwardens.

12 Post-town The next post-town is Bishop's Waltham.

1 Area The circumference of ground in the parrish of Eastmeon is by computation 12 miles. In Froxfield 6 miles. In Steep 4 miles.

2 Population The number of souls in Eastmeon parish are 962. The number of souls in Froxfield and Steep 475.

3 Marriages &c. The number of marriages one year with the other in Eastmeon are 3. Christenings 28. Burials 18. The number of marriages in Froxfield and Steep one year with the other are 5. Christenings 16. Burials 14.

4 Patron The patron of this living is the Bishopp of Winchester.

5 Chapels There are belonging to Eastmeon 2 chapels, viz. Froxfield and Steep, supplied by James Downes, in the nomination of the vicar of Eastmeon.

6 Lecturer No lecturer or curate in Eastmeon.

7 Papists No Papist in the parish of Eastmeon; in Froxfield 1, George Bruning.

8 Dissenters No meeting of protestant dissenters in Eastmeon, nor Froxfield, nor Steep.

9 Gentry &c. 2 gentlemen of distinction in Eastmeon, viz. Lewis Buckle Esq. and Philip Cavendish Esq. In Froxfield 1, Mr Love.

10 Schools No publick school endowed in the parish of Eastmeon. In Froxfield £1,000 left for the endowment of a charity school by Robert Love of Basing Esq. late deceased but not yet put in a method.

1 Area The parish of Eastmeon <is> supposed to be about 18 miles <in> circumference.

2 Population The number of souls, according to the best information is 963.

3 Marriages &c. Marriages 5; births 30; burials 20.

4 Patron The Hon. and Right Revd the Lord Bishop of Winchester.

5 Chapels The chapels of Froxfield and Steep are annexed to the vicarage of Eastmeon. The duty of Eastmeon and Froxfield is attended to by the resident vicar. The Revd Mr Stephen Street is curate of Steep, nominated by the vicar. An exact terrier for each of these 3 parishes is in your lordship's office.

6 Lecturer The 3 first queries in this article are answered in the above. The Revd Mr Stephen Street, curate of Steep, will reply to the last.

7 Dissenters There is nothing of the kind in any of the parishes.

8 Schools There are no endowed schools in the parishes of Eastmeon and Steep.

9 Charities There are none.

4 Patron The Revd Samuel Prince is patron of the living of East Tisted to the best of my knowledge, and the Revd George Watkins incumbent.

5 Chapels There are no chapels in the parish of East Tisted.

6 Lecturer I am curate and nominated by the rector, but not licensed.

7 Dissenters There are no Papists, nor meetings held of protestant dissenters, nor any sectaries in the parish of East Tisted.

8 Schools In the parish there is one endowed school, the number of scholars 14. Mr and Mrs Dyer have the management of it. A circumstantial account accompanies this.

9 Charities I send herewith a copy of the return which I made to the late parliamentary enquiry respecting charitable donations.

Copy of answers returned to the parliamentary enquiry, September 23, 1786

Revd Philip De Valois, late rector of East Tisted, deceased, in 1760 gave by will £350 for learning the children of East Tisted, viz. the boys to read and write, and the girls to read, write and sew; the numbers not limited. £150 was secured on mortgages on turnpike tolls in various parts of Hants and Surrey [listed], and £200 in 3% Consols, yielding in all £12 p.a. The management was vested in the incumbents of Farringdon, Chawton, Newton Valence, Colemore, Empshot and East Tisted for the time being and their successors for ever. The present trustees are the Revds — Randolph (Farringdon), John Hinton (Chawton), Edmund White (Newton Valence), James Cookson (Colemore), Griffith Richards (Empshot), and George Watkins (East Tisted).
