started a mile of pennies down the street

this inspired others & it was not long before
 a cabaret was organised & staged in
 the old hall, a Spring Bank Holiday
 Fête was held & all organisations in the
 village contributed & a large sum of
 money was raised, this was repeated
 last year, together with Coffee evening &
 Christmas Bazaars, Supper Party &
 Punchion Party, in September 1873 the
 old Hall was disposed of & then ^{came} the question
 of where to hold fashions, & here immediately
 Mr. Tordenskiold came forward with the loan
 of his barn or the ~~organisation~~ ^{use} of Barbecues
 complete with serving wench, & dances
 etc, all this enthusiastically supported
 ran by the local people we are indebted
 to Miss Blackman ^{& the Committee} for the use of the
 Methodist Chapel School room, as indeed
 we are for making the land available
 on which to build this Hall.

 We have had two sponsored walks in
 successive years which have been well
 supported & raised large sums, also in the
 last 600 years we have been supported
 by groups of people who have toured
 the village singing carols, In the latter
 part of 1973 a new exhibition
 was staged, which proved very interesting
 & attracted people from afar & helped to
 add our funds, we are grateful to
 school managers, the head masters for
 letting the school available on so many
 occasions, we have received ~~one or two~~^{several}
 substantial donations - in the past year or so.
 one must not forget the "Buy a Brick"
 campaign, which proved so successful.

We are very grateful to the numerous
 people who have organised all these fund
 raising events especially to the
 task of running the draws which have

been so frequent & raised so much money
& also our thanks to the folk who have
so generously contributed draw prizes
time after time. +

The HaPP Committee then had to start looking into the financial side of the project & having realised £18,000 on the sale of the old Hall, & still money's in hand & an estimate of £42,000 to consider, it was a difficult decision to make as to whether to proceed in two stages or the whole, it was decided to form a sub committee, to probe the possibility of interest free loans, to look over & ensure that we could start building, this was successful & we had one generous offer of the deficit, the contract was signed ~~a building site~~ & work started on Jan 14 last year, we now have 10 guarantors who have ~~offered~~ ^{Hague} interest-free loans, we have received grants from Parish Council, East Ham District & Dept ~~of Education~~ ^{Local Government}, & here are seen the result in this Hall, we hope to receive the second half of the grants on April 1st

this year, & then we shall know exactly what the ultimate deficit will be; but it must be stressed that we must still continue with our fund raising efforts *

~~One must not forget the responsibility of the builders who have done a good job & honoured their contract~~

forget our previous treasurer Mr Blowers who had the job of governing the building fund in its initial stages.

through the whole of this enormous task, we have had the expert advice of the Hauts

Council of Social Services, who I am sure will be pleased with the result, & glad to be rid of our constant pressure on them.
