 ordaine that thes Legacies shall be payd within one quarter of yeare after my w
 decease if my wife die before me but if it soe fall out my wife out live me then
 I ordaine that she shall have the use of all during her life and the Legacies to be payd
 within one quarter of a yeare after her decease In witness whereof I have hereunto
 putt my hand and Seale the fiftenth day of the moneth of January in the yeare of our
 Lord God One thousand six hundred fifty and seven The marke of John Hillam
 the older / Witness by Henry Cusper the marke of Mercury Cusper /

This will was proved at London the six and twentyth day of January in
 the yeare of our Lord God One thousand six hundred & fifty and seven before the Judges for
 probatoe of wills and granting Administration lawfully authorized by the Oath of John
 Hillam or the sonne sole Executor named in the said will to whom Administration of all the
 singular the goods Chells and debts of the said decessed was committed he being first by
 Commission sworn truly to do the same

In the name of God Amen the
 seven and twentyth day of December in the yeare of our Lord God one thousand six
 hundred fifty and two I Joane Bulbock of Oxenbourn in the parish of East Moon
 and county of South widow being very aged and knowinge the certainty of death
 and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being of perfect minde and memory
 praised be God therefore doe make and ordaine this my last will and Testament in
 in manner and forme followinge That is to say first and principally I Comend
 my Soule into the hands of Almighty God who gave it mee hopinge to be saved
 through the onely meritts death and passion of Iesus Christ my onely Lord and
 Saviour my body I Comitt to the Earth to be buried in decent and Christian like wa
 manner and for my worldly estate I dispose thereof as followeth I give unto
 the parish Church of East Moon aforesaid the summe of forty shillings Item I give unto
 my sonne Anthony Bulbock the summe of one shilling Item I give unto my daughter
 Anne the wife of Anthony Correll one shilling Item I give unto my daughter Jane
 the wife of Robert Eaton the summe of one shilling Item I give unto my daughter
 Alice the wife of Thomas Poole the summe of one shilling Item I give and give
 bequeath unto John Goodier of Peterfields aforesaid and to Charles Cranley of Ox
 Oxenbourn aforesaid each the summe of twenty shillings apiece And doe w
 appointe and desire them the said John Goodier and Charles Cranley to be the
 Overseers of this my last will and Testament And doe intreate them to be assistant
 to my Executor hereafter named in the recovery of my estate and payinge of my
 Legacies And doe nominate constitute and appointe William Poole the summe of
 Thomas Poole of Oxenbourn aforesaid to be the full and sole Executor of this
 my last will and Testament And doe give and bequeath unto him thes
 said William Poole all the rest and Residue of my goods Chattells and
 debts whatsover my funerall expences and Legacies being first payd

and discharged And I do hereby revoke all former wills by me heretofore
made In witness whereof I have hereto putt my hand and Seale the
day and yeare above writton The marks of Joane Bulbock Signed Sealed
and declared to be the last will and Testament of the said Joane Bulbock
in the presence of Cha. Cranley No. pub: Thomas Pook The marks of
William Baker the marks of Nicholab Bond /

This will was proved at London
the two and twoutyeth day of January In the yeare of our Lord God
One thousand six hundred fifty and five Before the Judges for
probate of wills and granting Administration lawfully authorized
by the oath of William Pook the sole Executor named in the said will
to whom Administration of all and singular the goods Chells and debts
of the said deceased was committed he being first by Commission so
sworne truly to Administer the same.

written with his own hand November the tenth unto Vincent 1649

Sr. John Oglander Knt. of the parish of Bradings in the Isle of Wight
County of Southampton being of good and perfect memory doe by this
present writing ordaine Manifest and declare this my last will and Testament in
manner and forme following First I bequeath my Soule into the hands of God
the blessed Trinity God almighty Creator and giver of all things humbly beseeching
his sacred Ma^{ty} for his infinite mercy and goodness And for the meritts of
his dearely beloved Sonne my onely Saviour Jesu Christ my Redeemer to accept
therof I doe my will is that presently after my death my body to (without
any solemnity Interred amongst my Ancestors in my Church in Bradings
Church betweene Oliver Oglaners my greates Grandfather Combe and the
East End of my foresaid Church from Jordano my Sonne Sr. William Oglaners
sole Executor of this my last will and Testament Item I give to the poore of Bradings
two poundes and to the poore of St. Hollens three poundes to be distributed to them
shortly after my death at the discretion of my Executor Item I give unto my Sonne
John Oglander over and besides the Lease of Hamphill that I have given him the
full summe of two hundred poundes in money to be payd to him by my Executor
within six monethes of my decease Item my will is that all such estates in my Land
and Tenements by mee formerly letten either by Lease or Copeny should be Confirmed
by my Executor Item I further give toward the erecting of a Combe for my father Sr.
William Oglaners and my selfe my father to be placed on the Southside of my Church
to be set in it and the Statue in my house to be placed thereon And my owne
Coate to be set at the East end of my greates Grandfather Oliver Oglaners with
the Statue already in my Church to be placed thereon And an inscription of brasse
to be set on the Combe showing when my selfe and wife dyed and the Combe
I have had And my Sonne Georges Statue who dyed in Cambray in Normandy to be
placed in the Church I made over the place I intend to be buryed in with the frame
in my Study to be now written I made in memory of him with an inscription in
brasse to be set over it showing whome he was the age time and place hee dyed
in for all which I give the summe of twenty and five poundes And I Charge my Executor
