Lilian May Baker, born 1914 granddaughter of Alfred Adams, the licensee of 'The George', East meon

Ethel Gladys Lambert, born 1892, father a blacksmith and postman

Evelyn Fisher, granddaughter of Alfred Adams (cousin of Lilian Baker)

Elizabeth May, born 1916, father a curate at East Meon 1907-1911 and during part of the 1st World War

Winifred Lunn born in 1885 in Liverpool, moved to East Meon in 1912 where her husband was a baker

Winifred Kate Lambert, born in 1894, her father William Micklam was an East Meon baker and delivery man

Reverend Peter Gallup, son of Henry Curtis Gallup of Bereleigh House, East Meon

Albert Smith, born 1899, father was a thatcher, hurdle maker and sheep shearer, their house was one of the ones destroyed by the fire in 1910

Herbert Goddard came to Oxenbourne in 1915 to live with his grandparents Mr and Mrs Thomas Goddard

Winifred Ellen Goddard born in East Meon 1909, daughter of William Christmas

John Macdonald, born in 1894 in East Meon

George Kille born 1907, son of George Kille builder and undertaker

Miss J Fosberry daughter of Frank Fosberry of East Meon

Albert Blackman born in East Meon in 1895 his father was a carrier at Old Down Farm

Frederick Gibbs, born 1905 worked for Countess Peel in the 1930s
