Eastmeon aforesaid. Widow deceased and which
premises were included in a general devise
contained in the Will of the said Joseph Eames
deceased to his Wife the said Mary Ann Eames
for her life but otherwise the said Joseph Eames
died intestate in respect thereof To hold to the
