- 1.) A monument to the pious memory of George Dickens gentleman of "Riplington" in this parish. d. 9 Dec: 1708 and Margaret his wife, she d. 19 May 1712
Erected by their sons
- 2.) A monument to Francis Dickens L.L.D. Professor Regius of Civil Law Cambridge. Fellow of Trinity Hall.
d. 15 June 1755
- 3.) A monument to Ambrose Dickens. Sergeant Surgeon to Queen Anne & King George I and II 1715. d. 29 Aug. 1747
His wife Elizabeth Moughton d. 1741
- 4.) Church "plate" given by Ambrose Dickens - was in use in 1899

Letters from vicar of E. Meon to Admiral Buckle (brother of Tony's grandfather. Capt. R.C. Buckle. R.N.) 1899.

"No trace of Borden - only Borden House. Owned by Chawner family. Bought by the grandfather of Capt. E Chawner (b. 1830) So ? approx. 1780? Rented to Col: & Lady Maria Sanderson.

House haunted! Many noisy happenings - no sightings. A member of the gambling party, half murdered at bottom of stone stair-case. Carried upstairs & died in a bedroom. - Thick baize door put up to deaden sound of blows etc: etc. etc: !! All this in a letter written by Capt. E Chawner."
